20 Years of the Gala of Hope

Twenty years ago, local community member Bev Martin started the first ever Gala of Hope: Denim & Diamonds (picture center in photo with 2023 Gala Chair Shannon Hayes, IHF 2023 President Dr. Paul Hammer, IH CEO Elise Cutter, and former IHF Executive Director Janie Crane). After losing her husband to cancer, Bev was faced with a choice: "Are you going to suffer, or are you going to serve?" She chose to serve, and because she did, countless patient lives have been touched by the funds raised over the years at the Gala of Hope.

At the 20th Annual Gala of Hope in 2023, over \$500,000 was raised, including \$335,145 in support through Heartstrings 'Raise the Paddle', making a transformational impact on a department at the center of healthcare: Diagnostic Technologies.

For many patients, Diagnostics Technologies are the key to their care plan, and having the best technology close to home makes a big difference.



Your support is critical in helping sustain 5-star quality healthcare close to home.

IHF Supports Emergency Services Project

Island Health has undergone a major update to facilities to enhance emergency services so you, your loved ones and neighbors have access to emergency care when needed most.

Island Health is relocating the helicopter pad from the north parking lot to the roof of our Acute Care Unit. This project also includes updates to the Emergency Department (ED) and Main Entrance (24th Street). IHF is proud to support this effort with a major gift of \$1.5M. Key highlights and benefits of the project include:

- Relocate helicopter pad to roof, closer to the Emergency Department
- Enhance building security for patients and staff
- ✓ Improve flight path for airlifts
- Create a true "front door" to Island Health on 24th Street
- **✓** Enable expansion of the 24th Street parking lot for expanded clinic space
- ✓ Improve patient flow and wayfinding



Island Health has a Level 3 Trauma designation and is a Department of Health Level 2 Category organization for both stroke and cardiac events. In order to receive and maintain these distinctions, patients must have access to CT technology 24/7.

Your support of Diagnostic Technologies through the 2023 Gala of Hope supported the continuation of this vital emergency service to our community
