What Dr. Ali believes is the essence of good parenting:

Unconditional Love: In the words of the distinguished developmental psychologist Urie Bronfenbrenner: "... in order to develop normally, a child requires progressively more complex joint activity with one or more adults who have an irrational emotional relationship with the child. Somebody's got to be crazy about that kid. That's number one. First, last, and always." Be crazy about your kid, it gives them wings.

Empathy: "Caretakers must find a way to decenter from their own needs and focus on and respond to what the child is experiencing." All parents have needs, but how we prioritize those needs is essential to being a resource to our children rather than an obstacle to their development.

Self-Awareness: "Children who encounter difficulties or become symptomatic create guilt and shame in their caretakers." It is totally normal to feel out of your depth as a parent, share this with others and get help.

Focus on the Relationship: "The feedback mechanism between caretaker and child, in which both parties need

affirmation and validation, is not restricted to infancy and early childhood." Relationships are healing. The better your relationship with your child, the better your child will do. ALWAYS focus on strengthening and acting in ways that are in service of your relationship with your child.

Meet Max. Max has always been a runner. Confident, steady, and strong, he's logged miles across marathons, backpacking trips, and his favorite four-mile loop in Anacortes. Last summer, as Max turned a familiar corner, an uneven sidewalk caught his stride. He felt himself falling — palms scraping first, then face striking the concrete. When he lifted his head, he saw his two front teeth lying on the ground in front of him. Blood covered his hands and shirt. With grit and determination, Max gathered his teeth and walked himself 21 blocks, straight to Island Health.

Max arrived at the ambulance bay where luckily a nurse saw him and rushed to meet him, quickly wheeling him back for care. The team immediately set to work. "I felt very safe there," Max says. "The care was excellent and personal—even the nurse who found me at the ambulance bay came back to check on me several times. I knew I was going to be fine."

Max is back to running three times a week. He carries his phone now, and he's more mindful of every step — but he hasn't let the fall stop him from doing what he loves. He and his wife Janet say the experience gave them tremendous confidence in Island Health's care. **"Good healthcare is so important as we age,"** Max shares. "Janet and I both agree — Island Health really came through and it reinforced our decision to support the Foundation."

Meet Mary. After a serious fall left her with a broken pelvis, longtime Anacortes resident Mary turned to Island Health. **"I was scared and in so much pain,"** she recalled "But, the moment I arrived at the Emergency Department, I felt like I was in good hands."

Mary spent several days in the hospital and several weeks in Physical Therapy, where she says, "Every session felt like a step toward getting my life back." Determined to stay strong, Mary joined $O(\log)^T$, a fall-prevention class offered through Island Health. "Otago has changed my life," Mary said. "It's given me balance, confidence and a community of support."

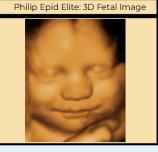
